Summary	<p>Project ROHU-289 aims at cross-border cooperation between the 2 localities by organizing cultural events, in order to preserve and promote common traditions and to support culture as an engine of sustainable social and economic development.</p> <p>The main activities of the project are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> organizing a 3 days cross-border handcrafts camp for 40 participants in Körösszegapáti, Organizing a joint cross-border handcrafts exhibition Organizing the Kun László Festival in Körösszegapáti (including an exhibition, a choir, a football match, folk dances) A 3 days ecumenical choir festival, organized in Körösszegapáti with a joint performances Organizing a 4 days folk dance camp in Vadul Crişului commune (RO); Organizing the festival called “Vama Sării”, in Vadul Crişului commune (RO) (including an exhibition, a choir, a football match, folk dances) Organizing a 4 days cross border football training camp for athletes from the two localities.

	<p>The Programme Output Indicator is „11/b2 <i>Number of people directly involved in cross-border cooperation initiatives</i>”. Project ROHU – 289 contributes to this indicator by reaching a number of 130 people from Romania and Hungary, participants in the cross border cultural activities.</p> <p>The project creates the opportunity for the inhabitants of the 2 communes to discover unique aspects of the cultural heritage of the communities they come from and help them gain a greater appreciation for their own culture.</p>
<p>Main results</p>	<p>The project’s main results are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 130 participants in cross-border cultural activities, - 3 organized camps (crafts, folk dances and folk) - 3 organized festivals, (Kun László in Kőrösszegapáti, “Salt Customs” in Vadul Crişului and one for ecumenical choirs)
